VINEYARD & TERROIR

The Neleman wines reflect the aromas and flavours of a precious and perfect terroir. The soil is white limestone with a surprising whiteness on the surface. When it dries up, the upper layers form a natural barrier, restricting evaporation. This reserve of moisture contributes to the roots development.



GRAPE VARIETY

VINIFICATION & AGEING

The grapes used to make this wine come from selected vineyards of the Verdejo variety. The vinification is somewhat complicated as we ferment the wine in French oak barrels but we also ensure that part of the wine is not aged in oak in order to ensure a touch of freshness on the nose and palate, so the lower alcoholic and more acidic plots are placed in separate tanks to obtain this freshness. The selection of the bunches in the winery and in the vineyard make this white wine one of the most unique of our All Day Long range.

TASTING NOTES

The nose reveals its rapid ageing in oak. Elegant aromas of toast and aniseed, as well as spices from the French oak and subtle toffee candies. The aromatic part of the variety is also present, being a wine with a fruity and herbaceous character. The palate is broad and velvety due to its time in oak, with medium acidity and a long, pleasant finish.
